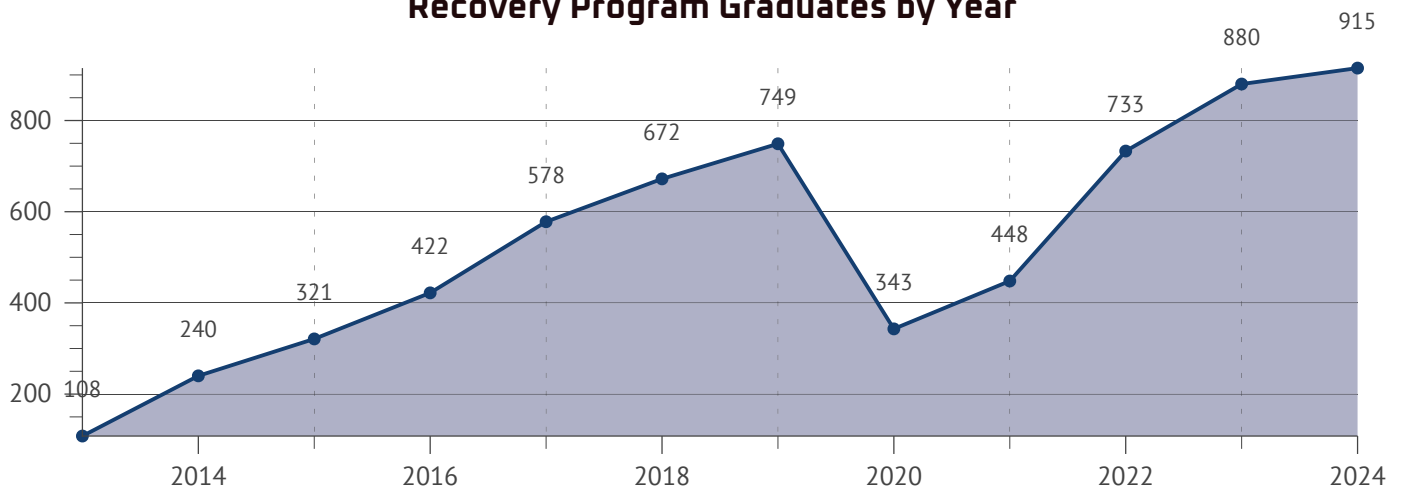

BUILDING & PROPERTY

Property Local Area Analysis: Based on Esri data presented by NAI partners, the demographics in the neighborhood are above average, with upside potential. Population growth has increased 37.88% since 2010 and is expected to increase 13.89% over the next 5 years in the 3-mile radius neighborhood. Average household incomes are above average at nearly \$115,900 and the area is populated with 7,456 households in a 3-mile radius around the property. Population growth and strong income levels are a good signal for potential single-family locations.

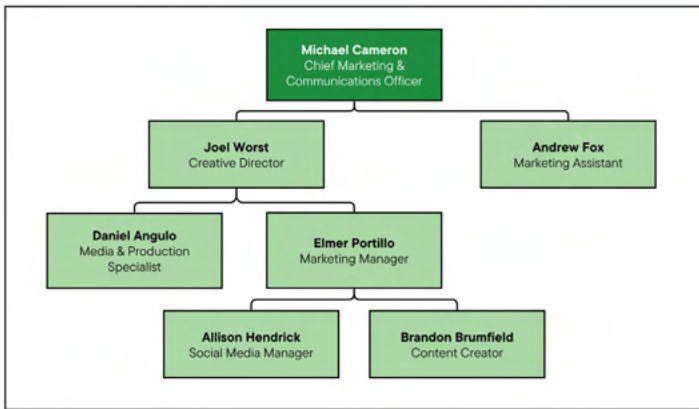

STATEMENT OF FUNCTIONAL EXPENSES

The **Statement of Functional Expenses** shows how expenses are incurred for the 3 functional areas established by the IRS for every non-profit organization in the U.S. This financial statements show if we are appropriately spending funds within appropriate categories according to IRS guidelines. Non-profits are expected to comply with IRS regulations that stipulate 70-80 percent of a company's expenses should be allocated to its **Programs** in order to successfully fulfill its mission that it is promoting to the public. 15-20 percent should be allocated to **Management and General Expenses**, and 15-10 percent should be allocated to **Fundraising Expenses**.

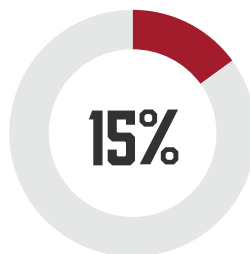

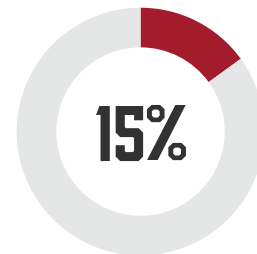
